Option 1: In order to demonstrate currency, an applicant seeking registration must have verifiable evidence of <i>instructing</i> a minimum of 24 hours of bushwalking on tracks classified as Class 5 or above as defined within the Australian Standard™. The sessions must:

OR Option 2: Meet the currency requirements of the relevant Re-registration Table for the previous 3 years (The Re-registration Table must be filled in and included in the application)		
There is a maximum of 8 logged hours per day that can be used for meeting registration requirements.		

Current First Aid and CPR Documentation*

* This evidence must be certified. Certified under the NOLRS means it has to be signed by somebody from the Australian Government's Statutory Declaration Signatory List.
